



THE RIGHT REVEREND PETER COLLINS

FIFTH BISHOP OF EAST ANGLIA



Peter Gwilym Collins was born on May 13, 1958, in the town of Tredegar, South Wales, and then nurtured with his three older sisters in the nearby village of Rhymney. He attended local Catholic primary and secondary schools and then briefly explored a pathway into teaching before being accepted for seminary formation in 1978. Following six years at the Royal English College, Valladolid, Spain, he was ordained to the priesthood for the Archdiocese of Cardiff on July 14, 1984. His philosophical and theological studies were undertaken at the Augustinian Faculty in Valladolid, at the Pontifical University of Comillas in Madrid and at the Pontifical University of Salamanca.

He served as an Assistant Priest in the Metropolitan Cathedral of St David, Cardiff, from 1984-86 and in Bridgend from 1986-88. He returned to Spain for post-graduate study before taking up his

appointment as Vice Rector at the Royal English College, serving there from 1989-94. Upon his return to the Archdiocese, he was appointed as Parish Priest of Chepstow and Caldicot. In 2001 he became Dean of the Metropolitan Cathedral in Cardiff, serving there for the next 18 years. In 2006, he was appointed as a member of the Metropolitan Chapter of Canons. In 2019, he moved to the next-door parishes of St Mary of the Angels, Canton and Holy Family, Fairwater.

Alongside his parish responsibilities, Bishop-Elect Peter Collins has served in a multiplicity of diocesan roles: 12 years as Chair of the Education Commission; ten years as Director of the Diaconate; 28 years in various safeguarding roles, being designated as Archbishop's Delegate to the first national meeting on safeguarding in 1995 and later serving as Coordinator and Clergy Advisor. He has also served as an area Dean, a member of the College of Consultors, a member of the Archbishop's Council and as a Trustee. He was appointed to the Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulchre of Jerusalem in 2004.

of the Clergy of the Archdiocese of Cardiff, currently Parish Priest of the Parish of Saint Mary of the Angels and the Holy Family, appointed Bishop of East Anglia, Greetings and Blessing.

Christ, the light of the world, in his divine love, sends those who are granted the episcopal service to proclaim the Gospel diligently, so that men and women, enlightened by the splendor of this truth, through which the Lord has saved the world from damnation and sin, may have a perpetual share in divine love and eternal life.

Knowing this well, We, who have received the Petrine ministry from the Saviour, carefully elect suitable men who take up this responsibility with Us. Since the Community of East Anglia has remained vacant since the resignation of our Venerable Brother Alan Stephen Hopes, We now wish to make provision for that situation. Since you, beloved son, are known for your prudence, sound doctrine and fruitful pastoral service, We have decided to entrust this task to you. Having listened to the opinion of the Dicastery for Bishops, by virtue of Our Apostolic authority, We invest you as Bishop of East Anglia, with all the rights and duties sanctioned by the Code of Canon Law.

You will inform the clergy and the people of this Letter of Ours, so that they may know who the new sacred Shepherd is as soon as possible. With regard to your episcopal ordination, We graciously allow you to receive it outside the city of Rome from any Catholic bishop, in compliance with the liturgical norms. First, you will have to make the Profession of Faith and the Oath of Allegiance to Us and Our Successors. Finally, We urge you to carry out your ministry for the salvation of the souls of the faithful in a pious, paternal and diligent way, through the intercession of the Blessed Virgin Mary, of Saint Peter the Apostle and of Saint David the bishop.







My brother, are you resolved by the grace of the Holy Spirit to discharge to the

end of your life the office the apostles entrusted to us, which we now pass on

to you by the laying on of hands?

Bishop-Elect: I am.

Bishop Alan: Are you resolved to be faithful and constant in proclaiming the Gospel of

Christ?

Bishop-Elect: I am.

Bishop Alan: Are you resolved to maintain the deposit of faith, entire and incorrupt, as

handed down by the apostles and professed by the Church everywhere and at

all times?

Bishop-Elect: I am.

Bishop Alan: Are you resolved to build up the Church as the body of Christ and to remain

united to it within the order of bishops under the authority of the successor of

the apostle Peter?

Bishop-Elect: I am.

Bishop Alan: Are you resolved as a devoted father to sustain the people of God and to guide

them in the way of salvation in co-operation with the priests and deacons who

share your ministry?

Bishop-Elect: I am.

Bishop Alan: Are you resolved to show kindness and compassion in the name of the Lord to

the poor and to strangers and to all who are in need?

Bishop-Elect: I am.

Bishop Alan: Are you resolved as a good shepherd to seek out the sheep who stray and to

gather them into the fold of the Lord?

Bishop-Elect: I am.

Bishop Alan: Are you resolved to pray for the people of God without ceasing, and to carry

out the duties of one who has the fullness of the priesthood so as to afford no

grounds for reproach?

Bishop-Elect: I am, with the help of God.

Bishop Alan: May God who has begun the good work in you bring it to fulfilment.



Laying on of hands

¶ Bishop Alan lays his hands upon the Bishop-Elect's head in silence, followed by the Coconsecrating Bishops and all the other Bishops present.

Book of the Gospels

¶ Bishop Alan places the open book of the Gospels over the head of the Bishop-Elect. Two deacons, standing at either side of the Bishop-Elect, hold the Book of the Gospels above his head until the prayer of consecration is completed.

Prayer of Consecration

¶ Bishop Alan extends his hands over the Bishop-Elect:

Bishop Alan: God the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ,

Father of mercies and God of all consolation,

you dwell in heaven,

yet look with compassion on all that is humble.

You know all things before they come to be;

by your gracious word

you have established the plan of your Church.

From the beginning

you chose the descendants of Abraham

to be your holy nation.

You established rulers and priests, and did not leave your sanctuary without ministers to serve you.

From the creation of the world

you have been pleased to be glorified

by those whom you have chosen.

¶ The following part of the prayer is recited by all the consecrating Bishops, without extending their hands:

So now pour out upon this chosen one that power which is from you, the governing Spirit whom you gave to your beloved Son, Jesus Christ, the Spirit given by him to the holy apostles, who founded the Church in every place to be your temple for the unceasing glory and praise of your name.

¶ Bishop Alan continues alone:

Father, you know all hearts.

You have chosen your servant for the office of bishop.

May he be a shepherd to your holy flock,
and a high priest blameless in your sight,
ministering to you night and day;
may he always gain the blessing of your favour
and offer the gifts of your holy Church.

Through the Spirit who gives the grace of high priesthood
grant him the power
to forgive sins as you have commanded,
to assign ministries as you have decreed,
and to loose every bond
by the authority which you gave to your apostles.

May he be pleasing to you by his gentleness and purity of heart, presenting a fragrant offering to you, through Jesus Christ, your Son, through whom glory and power and honour are yours with the Holy Spirit in your Holy Church, now and forever.

Anointing of the Bishop's Head

¶ Bishop Alan anoints the head of Bishop Peter with the Oil of Chrism, saying:

Bishop Alan: God has brought you to share the high priesthood of Christ.

May he pour out on you the oil of mystical anointing

and enrich you with spiritual blessings.

Presentation of the Book of the Gospels

so that when the chief Shepherd appears

Bishop Alan: Take this staff as a sign of your pastoral office:

keep watch over the whole flock

in which the Holy Spirit has appointed you to shepherd the Church of God.

Seating of the Bishop

¶ Bishop Alan leads Bishop Peter and invites him to sit on the Chair. A fanfare sounds.

Kiss of Peace

¶ The newly ordained Bishop receives the Kiss of Peace from Bishop Alan, and then from all the other bishops present. During this time, the choir sings the Motet 'Ecce Sacerdos Magnus'.
